ORDER

Per. Justice Gurpal Singh Ahluwalia

This petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India has been
filed seeking the following reliefs:

- "a) Issue an appropriate writ, order or direction directing the respondents to produce and verify the original physical OMR Answer Sheet of the petitioner pertaining to NEET (UG)-2026 by comparing the same with the scanned OMR Answer Sheet uploaded on the official portal;
- b) Direct the respondents, upon verification of the original OMR Answer Sheet, to evaluate/re-evaluate the petitioner's NEET (UG)-2026 examination on the basis of the original physical OMR Answer Sheet and to revise the petitioner's result, if any discrepancy is found, together with all consequential benefits, including consideration for counselling and admission in accordance with the revised result;
- c) Issue an appropriate writ, order or direction directing



the respondents to consider and decide the petitioner's representation dated 16.07.2026 by passing a reasoned and speaking order within a time frame as may be fixed by this Hon'ble Court;

d) Pending final disposal of the present writ petition, direct the respondents to forthwith preserve the petitioner's original OMR Answer Sheet and all connected physical and electronic records so that no alteration, overwriting, deletion or destruction thereof takes place;

e) Award the costs of the present petition in favour of the petitioner; and

f) Pass such other or further order(s) as this Hon'ble Court may deem fit, just and proper in the facts and circumstances of the present case."

2. In compliance of order dated 13.08.2026, the original OMR sheet was produced by Shri Manish Shrivastava, Assistant Director, National Testing Agency, New Delhi in a sealed envelop.

3. The sealed envelop was opened in the Court in the presence of counsel for petitioner, Shri Manish Shrivastava, Shri Praveen Newskar, counsel for respondents/Union of India. The petitioner was also present in the Court.

4. The original OMR sheet was shown to the petitioner. She fairly conceded that the original OMR sheet produced by respondents is her OMR sheet.

5. Since the controversy with regard to the correctness of the OMR sheet uploaded by the respondents has been resolved by production of the original OMR sheet and verification of the same by the petitioner herself, therefore, nothing survives to be decided in this writ petition.

6. Accordingly, the petition fails and is hereby **dismissed**.

7. The original OMR sheet was re-sealed by Shri Praveen Newaskar in



the open Court and the same has been returned back to Shri Newaskar.
