ORDER

1. The Respondent No. 3 - ICMR has filed the additional affidavit dated 22.07.2025 disclosing the timeline of 18 months for carrying out the study involving collection and analysis of biological samples to evaluate the health risk of flame-retardant exposure to the drivers. The disclosure so made by the Respondent No. 3 - ICMR in the affidavit dated 22.07.2025 is as under:

7. That it is humbly submitted that as per the proposal, the abovementioned research study would involve a zone stratified biomonitoring. That in terms of the proposal, completing laboratory analysis of bio-logical samples, data processing, statistical valuation, exposure modelling and reporting would require approximately eighteen (18) months. That a detailed chart providing comprehensive time lines for the respective phases is placed hereunder for ready reference:

That it is humbly submitted that apart from the time period as espoused/mentioned above, since a budgetary requirement of approximately Rs. 85,32,800/- (Rupees Eighty-Five Lakhs Thirty-Two Thousand Eight Hundred Only) is involved to conduct the proposed research study, due sanction and approval has to be obtained from the concerned authorities and therefore, additionally a period of nine months approximately would be required in obtaining the said requisite approvals/sanctions."
- 2. Dr. Sivaperumal, Scientist E, appearing on behalf of ICMR has submitted that the approval has been received day before yesterday and the work in terms of the disclosure made in the latest affidavit will commence within one week.
- 3. In view of this, we require the Respondent No. 3 ICMR to file the progress report atleast one week before the next date of hearing. The ICMR is also directed to expedite the work and make all possible efforts to ensure that the work is completed, as expeditiously as possible.
