ORDER

*Per. Justice Anand Pathak*

Petitioner and respondent No.4 are present in person.

2. Corpus is produced by S.I.-Pramod Sharma, Head Constable Arif Mohammad and Lady Constable - Swadesh Rajput, Police Station Antri, District Gwalior.

3. The present petition is in the nature of habeas corpus.

4. As per allegation, daughter of petitioner is in illegal confinement of respondent No.4. As submitted, corpus eloped with respondent No.4.

5. Dr. Anjali Gyanani, learned Government Advocate was earlier



appointed as Shaurya Didi and held the counseling with corpus today. She submits that corpus is major and wants to live in matrimonial fold with respondent No.4.

6. This Court raised specific query from corpus about her intention then she submits that she is major and entered into wedlock with respondent No.4 therefore, she wants to live with him and dose not want to live with her parents because her parents may harm her. Petitioner is father of corpus.

7. This Court raised specific query from petitioner then he submits that he is ready to accept the marriage with respondent No.4 but he wants ceremonies to be performed so that his social status may not be compromised.

8. Corpus is not ready to move with her parents and wants to live with her husband namely- Raghvendra Gurjar (respondent No.4 herein).

9. Considering the submission of corpus and the fact situation as well as the fate of counseling as referred by Dr. Anjali Gyanani, learned GA, no useful purpose would be served to keep this petition pending. Since, corpus is major and entered into wedlock with respondent No.4 therefore, she may move with respondent No.4 to live in matrimonial fold.

10. At this stage, corpus and counsel for respondent No.4 seek police protection so that they may reach to the home safely.

11. Considering the same, Officers who are present in the Courtroom are directed to take corpus safely to her matrimonial home with respondent No.4.

12. With the aforesaid, present petition stands disposed of.
