The petitioner is filing this petition in public interest seeking an intervention of this Hon'ble Court to provide ex gratia monetary compensation of Rs. 4 lacs/ notified ex gratia monetary compensation to the families of deceased who have succumbed to the side effect / post COVID-19 decease i.e. black, yellow, white fungus, in view of Section 12 of The Disaster Management Act, 2005.

That the petitioner also wants to bring to the judicial notice of this Hon'ble Court that this Hon'ble Court has

already pleased to issue notice in Writ Petition (C) No. 554 of 2021 titled as Reepak Kansal Vs Union of India, seeking ex gratia monetary compensation of Rs. 4 lacs / notified ex gratia monetary compensation to the families of deceased who have succumbed due to COVID-19.

There are several States which have also notified the mucormycosis or black fungus as notified disease under 'The Epidemic Diseases Act, 1897'.

The entire benefits / ex—gratia compensation under section 12 Disaster Management Act, 2005 for patients of COVID 19 may also be extended to the patients of post COVID 19 disease i.e. black fungus, yellow fungus and white fungus etc.

As per Section 12 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, The National Authority shall recommend guidelines for the minimum standards of relief to be provided to persons affected by disaster, which shall include ex gratia assistance on account of loss of life.

Section 12 (iii) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 is reproduced as under:

- 6. The petitioner states that no civil, criminal or revenue litigation involving the petitioner or which has or could have a legal nexus with the issue involve in the present writ petition.
- 7. That, the petitioner is citizen of India and filing the present writ petition for the common cause and the benefits of the society at large. The petitioner has been taking up public causes through various petitions before the Courts.

- 8. There is violation of Article 21 of the Constitution of India.
- 9. The injury caused to citizens who have lost their family members due to side effects / post COVID-19 decease i.e. Black Fungus, White Fungus & Yellow Fungus etc. The bread earner / Member of family died which has badly affected the livelihood of other family members. Their right to live with dignity is infringed due to death of earning member of family and no financial assistance is provided by the respondent as per of Rs. 4 lacs or notified ex gratia monetary compensation to the families of deceased who have succumbed to side effects / post COVID-19, in view of Section 12 of The Disaster Management Act, 2005.

- 10. That the petitioner states that he has not approached this Hon'ble Court or any High Court or any government authority earlier for the relief sought in this petition.
- 11. That the petitioner has not filed any similar petition previously before this Hon'ble Court or before any High Court seeking relief in the present Writ Petition.

12 <u>BRIEF FACTS</u>

- 12.1 The Disaster Management Act, 2005 was enacted.
- This Hon'ble Court has already pleased to issue notice in Writ Petition (C) No. 554 of 2021 ON 11/06/21 seeing ex gratia monetary compensation of Rs. 4 lacs / notified ex gratia monetary compensation to the families of deceased who have succumbed due to side effects / post COVID-19 disease.

13 GROUNDS OF THE WRIT PETITION

- A. Because, Article 21 of the Indian Constitution recognizes every individual's right to equality, which the Supreme Court has held includes the right to health.
- B. Because, the affected persons from side effects / post COVID-19 decease i.e. Black Fungus, White Fungus & Yellow Fungus etc. and their respective families require financial assistance under the State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) & National Disaster Response Fund (NDRF).
- C. Because, the respondents are unjustified in not giving ex gratia monetary compensation of Rs. 4 lacs to the families of deceased who have succumbed to side effects / post COVID-19 decease i.e. Black Fungus, White Fungus & Yellow Fungus etc., in view of Section 12 of The Disaster Management Act, 2005.

- D. Because, the patients suffering or died due to side effects / post COVID-19 decease i.e. Black Fungus, White Fungus & Yellow Fungus etc. may also be included in the category of COVID 19, a notified disaster.
- E. Because, the family members of the side effects / post COVID diseases are also entitled for ex-gratia compensation in view of Section 12 of The Disaster Management Act, 2005.
- F. Because, majority of patient with mucormycosis, or black, yellow & white fungus etc are those who have recovered from COVID 19. The treatment of COVID 19 leads to a weaken immune system, preventing the body from effectively preventing against infection. As a result, individuals recovering from COVID 19 are at risk for mucormycosis, or black, yellow or white fungus. The COVID 19 suppresses the immune system, so the immune system cannot clear other bacteria or fungi.
- G. Because, the Steroid treatments for COVID 19 is also act to suppress the body's immune response, contributing to these increased mucormycosis/ fungi infection.

- H. Because, the petitioner also wants to bring to the judicial notice of this Hon'ble Court that this Hon'ble Court has already pleased to issue notice in Writ Petition (C) No. 554 of 2021 seeking ex gratia monetary compensation of Rs. 4 lacs / notified ex gratia monetary compensation to the families of deceased who have succumbed due to COVID-19.
- I. There are several States which have also notified the mucormycosis or black fungus as notified disease under 'The Epidemic Diseases Act, 1897'.
- J. The entire benefits / ex—gratia compensation under section 12 Disaster Management Act, 2005 for patients of COVID 19 may also be extended to patients of side effects / post COVID 19 disease i.e. black fungus, yellow fungus and white fungus etc.
- K. Because it is obligation on the State to provide adequate relief to the victims of side effects / post COVID-19 decease i.e. Black Fungus, White Fungus & Yellow Fungus etc.
- L. Because without any financial assistance by the respondents in their respective State, the right to live with dignity of victim / family members of deceased, are violated which may kindly be protected.

- M. Because, due to death of bread earner / member of the family, the other members of family have been suffering without any financial assistance by their respective States.
- N. Because, there is a constitutional and legal obligation on the State and its different organs to take care of victims of the calamity and their family members, in the position of a guardian of parent of the people of the society.
- O. Because as per Art. 38. 1[(1)] of the Constitution of India, the State shall strive to promote the welfare of the people by securing and protecting as effectively as it may a social order in which justice, social, economic and political, shall inform all the institutions of the national life.
