			In compliance of the order dated 07.04.2021,
			passed by this Court, two affidavits have been filed.
			The first affidavit has been filed by Mr. Rajiv
			Bhartari, the Principal Chief Conservator of Forest
			(HoFF), Uttarakhand, and the second affidavit has
			been filed by Mr. Satyaprakash Singh, the Deputy
			Secretary, Forest Department, Government of
			Uttarakhand. Both the affidavits shall be taken on
			record.
			However, a bare perusal of both the affidavits
			clearly reveal that there is no indication whether the
			directions issued by this Court, by its order dated
			07.04.2021, have been complied with or not?
			By the said order, this Court had directed the
			State Government to ensure that sufficient fund is
			given to the Forest Department so that the vacancies

can be filled up. However, in neither of the two affidavits mentioned hereinabove, is there any indication whether sufficient funds have, indeed, been disbursed by the State Government to the Forest Department, so as to permit the Forest Department to fill up its vacancies, or not?

This Court had also directed the State Government to give sufficient funds to the Forest Department in order to buy the necessary equipments and to create physical infrastructure for fighting the forest fire which happen to be an annual phenomena in the State. However, there is no word in either of the two affidavits with regard to the same.

Likewise, this Court had directed the State Government to consider the possibility of equipping the State Disaster Response Force with necessary gadgets and equipment, including Helicopters and other aerial equipment. However, both the affidavits are silent on the issue whether the State Government is contemplating, or has already bought the Helicopters and other aerial equipment which are necessary for fighting the forest fire.

Similarly, this Court had directed the State Government to consider the possibility of creating artificial rain by cloud-seeding. Whether this possibility

	has been explored by the State Government, or not, is
	not revealed in either of the two affidavits.
	Therefore, Mr. Rajiv Bhartari, the Principal Chief
	Conservator of Forest (HoFF), Uttarakhand, is directed
	to submit a detailed report on the above mentioned
	issues before this Court, on or before 31.08.2021.
