He claims that he is a successful candidate of the NEET (National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test) (UG)-2004 conducted by the NTA (National Testing Agency) and has attained a rank of 4954 in General Category and is also ranked 11083 in the NEET All India Rank. His grievance is with



regard to two particular questions, which as per him have been wrongly framed i.e., one being out of syllabus while the other not providing the correct options/responses.
